Point 1: Victory Begins with Surrender

Before God brought down Jericho's walls, Joshua first bowed before the Commander of the Lord's army. Victory started with surrender.

2. What is one area of life where surrendering control to God is difficult for most people?

Spend time this week intentionally surrendering one specific burden, fear, or situation to Jesus in prayer instead of trying to carry it alone.

Point 2: Obedience Often Comes Before Understanding

God's instructions for Jericho seemed unusual, but Israel's victory came through faithful obedience.

1. Why is it sometimes hard to obey God when His plan does not make sense right away?
2. Can you think of a time when obedience to God eventually produced growth or blessing in your life?

Ask God to show you one practical step of obedience you need to take this week—even if it feels uncomfortable or inconvenient.

Point 3: God Can Tear Down Strongholds

Jericho's walls represent spiritual strongholds—patterns of thinking, habits, fears, or sins that keep us trapped.

1. What are some common "walls" or strongholds believers struggle with today?
2. According to 2 Corinthians 10:3–5, how does God help us fight spiritual battles differently from the world?

Identify one negative thought pattern or stronghold you want God to help tear down. Replace that lie with a specific truth from Scripture this week.

Challenge:

This week, don't stop marching. Even if the walls haven't fallen yet:
Keep praying. — Keep obeying. — Keep trusting Jesus.
